Our Purpose:

Camp Shepard Day Camp is a 8 week program designed to make sure youth have the best summer ever! Campers will establish everlasting friendships each day while having an outdoor education experience. Our goal is to provide a new, safe, and fun experience for all ages and to allow our campers to have the best summer ever!

How to Register:

Registration is a first come, first serve basis. Sessions may fill up, so reserve your child's spot for each session by making a deposit.

Registrations can be processed at the Reception Desk of the YMCA of Greater Westfield located at 67 Court Street in Westfield, MA. Turn in your completed registration packet, a deposit to secure your camper's spot, all health forms and immunization records. Contact the Camp Director with any questions at (413)568-8631 ext. 312.

All of the programs at the YMCA of Greater Westfield are open to everyone regardless of town of residence.

Financial Assistance:

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The YMCA of Greater Westfield, as a charitable tax-exempt organization, provides financial aid to those families who qualify. Applications are available at our reception desk.

This camp complies with regulations of the Massachusetts Department of Public Health and is licensed by the local Board of Health.

Camp Quick Hints:

Is there a lost and found?

Yes! But please label everything you send with your campers to decrease the number of lost items. Lost & Found will be removed from camp weekly.

Will my camper get dirty?

Absolutely! That's the fun about camp! So be prepared for all of their items to get dirty as well. Campers should also be sent with a rain jacket in case of rain. Lastly, please do not send any valuable items with your campers!

Can camp staff apply sunscreen and bug spray to my child?

Yes! Please sign off on page 6 to allow staff to apply sunscreen/ bug spray. Otherwise, we cannot do it.

What about lunches?

They're delicious and important! Unfortunately we do not supply them. So please send your campers with a bagged lunch. We will store all lunches in a cool dry spot.

What if I need to pick up my camper early or drop them off late?

That's more than ok. Please go through the camp office to do so. If they need to be picked up early please send a note or call ahead of time. If they will be absent or late please call the office to let us know at 413-568-8952.

Do you provide snacks?

No we do not. But feel free to send them along and we will make sure your child will eat them!

Be Prepared to Get Dirty & Label Everything.

Lunch:

Campers bring lunches in paper lunch bags or soft containers. They are collected at the beginning of the day and are kept secure in a cool, dry place. Please pack any additional snacks for your camper to have throughout the day in their backpack. Drinks should only be in plastic containers, no glass.

Pick up/Drop off Procedures:

• Camp Shepard will only release campers to adults listed on the registration under "Authorized Pick Up."

• All adults must provide a photo State I.D. at the time of pick up.

• All visitors must check-in at the Camp Shepard Administrative Office located at 360 Northwest Road and must receive a signed pass from the Camp Director, Assistant Camp Director or Office Manager.

• Early pick up/late drop off: If you are picking up or dropping off your camper outside of the scheduled times you must do so at the Camp Shepard Administrative Office (the brown house) located on 360 Northwest Road which is right next to Camp Shepard's main entrance. Sending a note with your camper will increase the efficiency of this process greatly.

• Camp gates are closed between 9:15 am -3:30pm. All visitors must report to the camp office during these times.

EMERGENCY CONTACTS AND AUTHORIZED PICK UPS

In addition to parents/guardians listed on page 5, ONLY those on the Authorized Pick Up / Emergency Contact list will be allowed to pick up campers from camp. In emergency situations only, parents/guardians may give written permission for an individual who is not on this list to pick up child. No child will be released without emergency written permission. Please indicate if a non-custodial parent has limits on visitation or pick up. If a non-custodial parent has been denied visitation or has limited visitation by court order, a copy of the order must be given to the YMCA and kept on file at the program. By signing this form, you agree to the Authorized Pick Up / Emergency Contact arrangement as stated above.

PARENTS AGREEMENT

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• A \$50 non-refundable deposit is required for each session and must accompany each application. This deposit will hold the camper's place and will be applied to the full camp tuition. Remaining balances must be paid by the Thursday prior to the beginning of the registered session. Campers may not attend any session until their balance is paid in full.

• After the due date, any new registration requires payment in full and a completed health form.

• Requests for changes in camp session or group assignment will be honored only if space permits.

• The YMCA reserves the right to dismiss a camper whose behavior is detrimental to other campers, themselves and/or camp

• Fees will not be refunded for absence, failure to attend during the camp session, delayed attendance at camp, or dismissal.

Health forms and immunization records are required for each camper PRIOR to attending camp. Forms will be given to parents at registration and must be completed and signed by parents/guardians before the camper attends camp. The YMCA does not retain records from previous years.

Assumption of Risk

I, in my legal capacity as parent/guardian of the minor named below ("Minor"), acknowledge and agree that any use of The YMCA of Greater Westfield's facilities, services, equipment and premises ("Facilities") and any participation in The YMCA of Greater Westfield's programs and activities ("Programs") comes with inherent risks including, but in no way limited to: (1) moderate and severe personal injury, (2) property damage, (3) disability, (4) death, and (5) sickness or disease. I voluntarily, for myself and Minor, accept and assume full responsibility for these risks as well as any and all other risks of the use of Facilities and participation in Programs. I agree that I have full knowledge of the nature and extent of all such risks and am not relying on all such risks being described in this document.

Camp Shepard Age Groups

YMCA Camp Shepard consists of children between the ages of 4 and 14. Campers are placed into Units based on the grade they are entering in the fall as well as their age. They are then further divided into small groups within the unit maintaining counselor to camper ratios per our DPH license. Units are not just age groups but small communities that demonstrate pride and camp spirit.

VIKINGS: Ages 4, 5, 6 • Grades Pre-K, K, 1

This program is especially designed for the younger camper and maintains a 5:1 camper to counselor ratio. They will participate in activities specially geared to their age level. Campers experience the same activities as the older groups, participating in swim lessons, recreational swim, arts and crafts, ropes, kayaking, nature, sports, story time and more! This unit is lead by a Unit Head who is dedicated to making sure our youngest campers have the best experience possible. Our Unit Head has a high level of professionalism and a deep understanding of the needs of our youngest campers.



TEEN LEADERS: Ages 13, 14 (co-ed) • Grades 8, 9

Campers in the Teen Leaders Group participate in camp activities at a higher skill level. Special projects, trainings and activities such as mountain biking, hiking, high and low ropes adventure are included in this fun and challenging teen program. This program also involves developing leadership skills, including communication, decision making, conflict resolution and more. These skills will benefit teens in their home, school and community. These skills are taught through many activities and projects such as discussions, teambuilding challenges and service-learning activities all while emphasizing the YMCA's four core values of Caring, Honesty, Respect and Responsibility. It's the last year to enjoy camp as campers while starting to make the transition toward greater responsibility.



SPARTANS: Ages 7, 8, 9 • Grades 2, 3, 4 **& TITANS:** Ages 10, 11, 12 • Grades 5, 6, 7

Programs for this age group are designed to achieve a balance of instruction and recreation as well as group development and individual accomplishment. Emphasis is placed on cooperative learning and the YMCA four core values: Caring, Honesty, Respect, and Responsibility. Campers will participate in fun and challenging activities that meet their individual interests, abilities and needs. The goal is to have each camper have a sense of belonging, make new friends, achieve new goals and have fun.
